Distinguished Service and Excellence in Film Award

This award is presented to an individual whose use of media has helped nationally to: (1) increase public awareness of the impact of interpersonal violence on the health status of individuals, communities, or the general population; and/or (2) alert the public to the social, political, and institutional pressures that often serve to inhibit disclosure of abuse by children or adults, and impede appropriate prosecution and treatment of child abuse or family violence once disclosure is made. This award is presented to Dr. Carolyn West, a Professor of Clinical Psychology at the University of Washington. Dr. West is an international speaker, filmmaker, author, domestic violence expert, cultural sensitivity trainer, and expert witness. She was a writer and producer of *Let Me Tell Ya'll Bout Black Chicks: Images of Black Women in Pornography* and made appearances in *Subjects of Desire*, *Chris Brown: A History of Violence*, and *Diddy: The Making of a Bad Boy*.
